Mandatory topics include, Stress Management (self care), Nutrition & Budgeting, Childhood Diseases & Immunization, Child Safety 1&2, Child Rearing, Child Development and Developmental Activities, Hygiene. This program is offered twice a year 8 sessions.

Parent's Circle:

Weekly parents circle is a place to share the joys and challenges of parenting. Come into a safe environment to connect, share and grow with other families.
