QUALIFICATIONS:

- A minimum combination of three (3) plus years of post-secondary education and experience relating to youth mental health, addictions and youth in the justice system;
- Strong knowledge of urban Indigenous issues and needs is an asset;
- Knowledge of the inner workings of the local justice system is an asset;
- Knowledge of Fetal Alcohol Spectrum Disorder is an asset;
- Crisis intervention training, anger management training, Applied Suicide Intervention Skills Training (ASIST) and First Aid/CPR certificates are essential;
- Ability to work collaboratively within multi-sector groups and independently;
- Good time management and organizational skills;
- Computer literacy and strong written and oral skills;
- Willing to work flexible hours (evenings and weekends);
- Must have a valid drivers' license and clean drivers' abstract;
- A recent (within 3 months) CPIC/Vulnerable Sector Check required
