INDIGENOUS HEALTHY BABIES/HEALTHY CHILDREN WORKER

STATUS: Permanent Full Time: 35 hours/week

POSITION: The Indigenous Healthy Babies Healthy Children Worker (IHBHCW) is to be a helper, an auntie or an uncle to families of the urban Indigenous population within Nipissing District. They will promote healthy growth and development of Indigenous children; build on parenting skills, and link families with community supports and resources. The IHBHCW will work with families in their home environment from the prenatal period to age 6 years.

ACCOUNTABILITY: This position reports directly to the Executive Director.

QUALIFICATIONS:

- Social Service Worker Diploma and/or 3 to 5 years relevant work experience.
- Strong knowledge of urban Indigenous issues.
- Crisis intervention training, anger management training, Applied Suicide Intervention Skills Training (ASIST) and First Aid/CPR certificates are essential.
- Working knowledge of traditional teachings, urban and on-reserve culture.
- Ability to work independently and collaboratively within multi sector groups.
- Very good time management, organizational and problem-solving skills.
- Computer literacy and strong written and oral skills.
- Willing to work flexible hours.
- Must have a valid drivers' license, clean drivers' abstract, appropriate insurance and access to a reliable vehicle.
- CPIC/Vulnerable Sector Check will be a condition of employment.
