QUALIFICATIONS:

- A minimum combination of three (3) years of education and experience relating to youth mental health, addictions and youth in the justice system.
- Strong knowledge of urban Indigenous issues and needs, and inner workings of the local justice system and knowledge of fetal alcohol spectrum disorder (FASD) is an asset.
- Crisis intervention training, anger management training, applied suicide intervention skills training (ASIST) and First Aid/CPR certificates are essential.
- Ability to work collaboratively within multi sector groups and independently.
- Time management and organizational skills.
- Computer literacy and strong written and oral skills.
- Willing to work flexible hours including evening and weekend programming.
- Must have a valid driver's license and provide a driver's abstract.
- A recent Vulnerable Sector check is a condition of employment.
